

Graduate Certificate of Executive Leadership and Management

2024 Schedule

The Graduate Certificate of Executive Leadership and Management consists of three units delivered one at a time through 2024.

Course orientation: Wednesday 6 March 5pm – 6pm, via Teams

Unit 1 – Managing People and Organisations (FBL5010 – 24PR1)

In this unit the focus is on the individual student as a maturing manager – their knowledge, skills and abilities in the context of organisational structures and purposes, and how people are managed to achieve organisational success. This unit introduces students to the fundamentals of management and the different organisational processes in the context of the contemporary global business environment. Particular emphasis is placed on the application of theory to dilemmas and issues likely to confront managers today and in the future.

- Final assessment due by Monday 29 April.

Unit 2 – Responsible Management (MBA6010 – 24TE3)

Responsible management focuses on building ethical awareness in an increasingly complex and global environment. Students will develop and evaluate individual perspectives on ethics and responsible management, while exploring organisational factors such as corporate social responsibility, sustainability, governance, and citizenship in local and international contexts. The aim is for students to develop a responsible business mindset through examining the roles and responsibilities of businesses towards sustainability grand challenges, such as climate change and social inequality.

- Intensive on-campus block of teaching: Monday 15 and Tuesday 16 July.
- Remaining online content runs until Friday 23 August.
- Final assessment due by Monday 26 August.

Unit 3 – Transformative Leadership (MBA6064 – 24TE4)

Leadership represents the most important area of competence for managers today. This unit first acquaints students with contemporary theories and then unpacks a toolkit of practical skills for professional development across relevant topics. Important aspects of the modern international business environment are discussed to develop a global perspective. The focus is on personal growth and enabling positive transformation.
